


# Immersing in Indigenous culture and engaging in preservation of vital community construction

**Overview:** The Cherokee Nation is a federally recognized tribe of the United States. Originally from the Southeast, the tribe was forcibly relocated on the Trail of Tears. Today, the Cherokee Nation faces poverty, unemployment, and poor-quality housing while working to preserve the tribe's language, history, and culture.



The Nitty-Gritty Details: Housing facilities include showers, restrooms, and a full kitchen. There is a kitchen at the housing site, and the group will have a small budget for groceries to cook their own breakfast, sack lunches, and dinners.

**Transportation:** Participants will travel by a 10 person van to the destination. The van will be used throughout the week for local transportation.


