Overview: The mission of the Medici Project is to help students gain clarity in how they can leverage their passions and skill sets to serve others, predominately through future vocations they are pursuing. Being exposed and understanding how they can make a strategic impact in their own communities is vital to influencing culture for the common good. Medici Nashville tackles the social justice issues of homelessness, hunger, and poverty, while also highlighting social entrepreneurship service and how it incorporates business funding social issues and causes.

Day-to-day: Service will consist of a morning session from 9:00am – noon, and an afternoon session from 1:00 – 5:00pm each day. Students will be working with various organizations in the community to have a hand in multiple types of service.

The Nitty-Gritty Details: The group will be staying in a church, and the housing is fully arranged by Medici. Students will need to bring their own pillows as well as blow-up mattresses or mats. Students will be given a small budget for groceries, and there is a kitchen at the housing site to prepare food.


