

Cape Town: SOUTH AFRICA May 7-22, 2018



Overview: For the seventh year in a row, Ohio State will return to Cape Town to serve the local community and continue to build relationships with local non-profit organizations. This trip will focus on the themes of education, health awareness, women/gender and international development as students will learn how these issues intersect with the history, culture, politics and economy of South Africa. Additionally, students will have cultural lessons throughout the trip to learn about language, music, dance and history and will visit several of the city's main attractions.

Day-to-Day: Service work centers primarily around a community organization called Sakhulwazi, located in Philippi Township. This organization seeks to empower the local community through women employment and teaching beading and sowing. The center also operates a community garden. Students will engage with the women and assist in the garden on most days.
