Overview: GMHC is the world's first and leading provider of HIV/AIDS prevention, care and advocacy. Meals are not provided by the housing or service sites but the group will be given a small grocery budget to purchase food and make meals throughout the week. Participants should expect to spend additional funds on some meals and free time in the city. Public transportation will be utilized daily to get across the city.
