Easter Seals: Empire, CO

Easter Seals is a national organization that originated in 1919 as the National Society for Crippled Children in Elyria, Ohio. After the success of its Easter "seals" campaign, the organization took on the name Easter Seals in 1967. Rocky Mountain Village is an Easter Seals camp near Empire, Colorado, used by more than 800 children and adults with disabilities in the Summer season. During the week, campers come to enjoy swimming, fishing, camping, hiking, music, and drama, among many other constructive activities. Throughout the year, Rocky Mountain Village also operates as a respite camp and offers weekend R&Rs. Buck-I-SERV volunteers will assist camp directors to restore the camp from its Winter conditions and prepare the camp for the Summer season. This may involve outdoor projects in the snow, warm clothing and footwear is encouraged. Rocky Mountain Village is on the edge of Arapaho National Forest near many outdoor recreational sites including hiking trails, waterfalls and lakes. Outside of service hours, participants will have the opportunity to explore the Rocky Mountain sites in the

surrounding area.

GUADALUPE CENTER

Located in Immokalee, Florida in a community where over 40% of the population lives below the poverty level and 97% of school aged students are economically needy, the Guadalupe Center began in 1982 as a soup kitchen to meet the immediate needs of impoverished families living in Immokalee. An afterschool tutoring program serving just 30 children began in the soup kitchen which later became the Guadalupe Center. Today, the Guadalupe Center includes a soup kitchen, clothing center, college preparatory center and a shower center for those in need. Most of the children at the Guadalupe Center come from homes where Spanish is their native language and many families in the community are migrant workers in the tomato fields. While in Immokalee, some group will have the chance to work with The Coalition of Immokalee Workers (CIW). CIW is an organization that focuses their efforts on bettering the lives of migrant workers in the area. Groups may meet with the Coalition to learn more about the issues migrants face and the culture of the local community.

Forest Animal Rescue: SILVER SPRINGS, FL

For those whose hearts have a little bit of a wild side, Forest Animal Rescue is a lifetime care sanctuary for non-releasable wild animals who have narrowly survived lives of abuse or neglect. The animals have been confiscated by authorities, used in research, abandoned to starve or have been attempted pets that failed because of their wild nature. At Forest Animal Rescue these animals are given the best veterinary care, a healthy diet and playmates of their own kind as appropriate. They regain confidence as their bodies gain strength, and they learn to appreciate the humans who have come to their aid. The animals in their care range from big cats to bears, wolves, primates, bats and more. Students will be helping with the construction of the sanctuary and assisting with the regular maintenance of the acres. **As a true sanctuary, the animals at Forest Animal Rescue are never bred, sold or exploited in any way. Founded in 1998, Forest Animal Rescue is highly respected and internationally recognized.

Florida's Aquatic Preserves: ST. PETERSBURG, FL

Much of Florida's distinctive character lies in the beauty of its coastline. The best of the coastal landscapes have been set aside for protection as aquatic preserves. This natural beauty has always been one of Florida's major attractions for both tourists and residents. Ironically, the very features that have drawn people to Florida are potentially endangered by the increased population pressures. Aquatic preserves protect the living waters of Florida to ensure that they will always be home for bird rookeries and fish nurseries ... freshwater springs and salt marshes ... sea grass meadows and mangrove forests. The week is busy, but students go home with many valuable experiences to pass on to their own communities. Here, students have the ability to engage in community service activities while enjoying Florida's wonderful weather and coast, the best of both worlds. You will get a chance to work with invasive exotic plants, such as the Brazilian pepper, and to remove debris from spoil islands.

MEDICI PROJECT: ATLANTA

Medici Project serves to educate and expose individuals to the realities of poverty for Atlanta's inner city youth and what is being done to fight against that poverty. While in Atlanta, your primary job is to build relationships with at-risk urban youth through personal interaction. You will do hands-on service with the Medici Project and other organizations who are seeking to make an impact in the lives of at-risk children and youth. The 30318 zip code, where Medici Project serves all throughout the year, is one of the neediest areas in the country. 50% of the youth in this area will not finish high school. The average household income is just under \$11,000 a year, less than 1/3 of the average. national In one community, 60% of the residents are HIV positive. A staff member expert will accompany your group education and provide and guidance as you work with the atrisk urban youth of Atlanta. Participants on this trip will work at various sites throughout the week.

By serving society's most vulnerable citizens, Misericordia offers both independent and assisted living, education, employment, recreation, and more to over 600 individuals from diverse racial. religious, and socio-economic backgrounds each day on its 31acre campus just outside of downtown Chicago. Volunteers will be assisting residents with daily tasks, preparing meals, helping with laundry services, visiting with clients, and working in the on-site bakery.

LOWER NINE: New Orleans, Louisiana

Lower Nine is an organization that works with residents of the Lower Ninth Ward of New Orleans to help rebuild the area after it was devastated by Hurricane Katrina and Rita. To date, lowernine.org has fully rebuilt seventy-five homes, and has completed smaller repair and renovation projects on hundreds more, bringing home more Lower Ninth Ward families organization. than anv other However, as of 2014, population return is only 34% - lagging far behind the rest of the City of New Orleans, whose population return is nearly 90%. Because the Lower Ninth Ward was an area hit hardest by the hurricanes, Lower Nine takes a holistic approach to healing the community; volunteers will be rebuilding/constructing working houses. in urban community gardens, providing social and emotional support as well as community outreach to the New Orleans community. Lower Nine is committed to sustainable economic solutions. We provide all necessary project training and tools, so even if you've never swung a hammer - YOU can help rebuild homes destroyed bv Hurricanes.

During our stay, the Special Olympics High School Track and Field Championships will be taking place in which our students will be assigned various jobs. Upon returning, the students should have a better understanding of the mission of Special Olympics: to give continuous opportunities to athletes with disabilities in order for them to develop physical fitness and demonstrate courage as well as the experience of joy and sportsmanship fostered in athletic competition.

The children being served by the camp include children who identify as LGBTQ, who are affected by HIV/AIDS, have diabetes, and/or who live in transitional housing. It is important to note that during the trip, the children will not be present but the service is meant to prepare the camp for the children's arrival later in the summer months. Past groups have carved signs, painted, built outdoor furniture, and worked to improve the grounds for the camp. The camp has left powerful impacts on several students who have returned to Minnesota during the summer to serve as camp counselors.

North Carolina Coastal: NEWPORT, NORTH CAROLINA

Located in Newport, North Carolina near the Outer Banks and for more than 30 years, the North Carolina Coastal Federation has worked with people to safeguard the coastal rivers, creeks, sounds and beaches of North Carolina. The N.C. Coastal Federation has been able to preserve more than 10,000 acres of threatened coastal land since its establishment and has received multiple prestigious Pelican Awards that honor groups that exhibit exemplary performance in improving environmental quality on the N.C. coast. Service will consist of mostly environmental work, including wetland restoration, oyster habitat restoration, clean up, and other project maintenance. There will also be an opportunity to partner and serve with Hammocks Beach State Park in additional environmental work.
